The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M.

1. **Introductions were made.**
2. **Approvals of Minutes** – Minutes from the August 11, 2011, September 8, 2011, October 13, 2011 November 10, 2011 and December 8, 2011 meetings were tabled to the February 9, 2012 meeting, due to the lack of a quorum.
3. **Election of Officers** – The election of officers was tabled due to the lack of a quorum.
4. **Update on Valley District Activities** – George Aguilar reported on the Watersmart Project. Home Depot stores are showing a significant increase in sales and are the only participating store in the project at this time. Valley District is in communications with Lowes and other nurseries with regard to the program. Mr. Aguilar believes that with the help of additional promotions, including bill board ads and agencies partnering up with Valley District, the program will expand and become more successful. Mr. Aguilar also reported on the following Valley District activities:
 - Solar race sponsorships – The program is helping to bring science focus back to high schools, as it promotes sciences and emphasis on water.
 - SAWPA is hiring grant writers to assist agencies with writing grants for the next round of Proposition 84 grant funding opportunity.
 - Pilot Project for community garden involving seniors and kids together at old well site near 9th Street and Mount Vernon Elementary School.
 - Contest for the most water efficient lawn to emphasize the Watersmart Project with the local water agencies.

Tom Crowley reported the Basin Technical Advisory Committee (BTAC) conservation subcommittee meeting is scheduled to meet later in the day is to discuss the deadline for a Watersmart grant submission to the United States Bureau of Reclamation for the Regional Rebate Program.

5. Legislative Update - Manny Aranda reported speaking to Fred Hicks, a lobbyist from Hicks-Ray Associates in Washington, D.C., regarding Congress reconvening on January 20, 2012 to discuss constitutional issues. The President is expected to call an executive order indicating Congress' inability to accomplish much due to an election year. Mr. Aranda also reported on the potential tax on the rich to fund social services programs throughout California. He also reported that the Santa Ana Sucker fish litigation is ongoing and may go away if there is an administrative change.

6. Other –The group brainstormed on how to effectively ensure that all members attend monthly meetings. Discussion included potential structural changes to the meetings, as well as amending the mission of the Association. Chairman Araiza stated the group should recruit additional speakers to make presentations on topics of interest related to political water issues, as the BTAC provides a more technical overview of resolving the basin issues. Mr. Aranda offered to approach local Supervisors and both Senators Dutton and Emmerson to speak at upcoming 2012 meetings. Tom Crowley volunteered to report back to the BTAC and the subcommittees regarding the possibility of alternating monthly meetings with the USAWRA to circumvent overlap of discussion topics.

7. Committee Reports & Schedules:

➤ **Recharge Committee** – Daniel Cozad reported on the following recharge activities:

- Recharging 10 – 20 cfs in Mill Creek; Santa Ana River water is being picked up by surface water users.
- Seven Oaks Dam – The water conservation study is pending. Valley District is in constant communications with the USACE in hopes of keeping the water conservation study moving forward.
- Finalizing existing contracts for aggregate mining.
- Potential budget increases that may impact current San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District recharge rates.
- Two vandals arrested for cutting locks and entering District property. All steel and fabricators for all bronze wirings in Lockhead Martin will be removed.

➤ **Basin Technical Advisory Committee** – Tom Crowley reported on the draft Conjunctive Use Rules and the presentation that will be made at the upcoming BTAC meeting for consideration and adoption of incorporating the rules into the management procedures for agencies interested in conjunctive use.

➤ **Seven Oaks Dam Water Quality Committee** – This item was covered earlier in the meeting.

➤ **Santa Ana Sucker Task Force** – No report.

3. SBVMWD Activities – Bob Tincher reported on the following SBVMWD activities:

- A letter has been sent to the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) regarding the water conversation and water quality studies and the current delays.
- Audit report received and file for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2011.
- Approval of (2) agreements allowing for the purchase and subsequent sale of 0.8 mgd of treatment and disposal capacity and pipeline capacity.
- Enhanced Recharge – A fault has been discovered 400 ft. below land surface near the proposed recharge ponds, acting as an underground barrier. Groundwater modeling will be conducted to determine whether there is enough depth for recharge. SBVMWD Board has approved staff to obtain a proposal for the work.

4. Legislative Update - Manny Aranda reported on the state legislature's plan to place on the November 2012 ballot several initiatives to raise taxes to purportedly reduce the budget deficit. Mr. Aranda also reported on the general obligation bonds to fund projects that improve water quality, restore ecosystem health and reduce the seismic risk to Delta water supplies.

5. **Other** – No other items were reported on.

6. **Committee Reports & Schedules:**

➤ **Recharge Committee** – Daniel Cozad distributed and summarized the San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District’s Monthly Recharge Report. Mr. Cozad also reported the District’s ponds will be graded and cleaned to prepare for the anticipated winter rains and announced the United States Fish & Wildlife Service’ (USFWS) efforts to revamp the Wash Plan. He stated biologists have been conducting assessments on site regarding the District’s existing operations and maintenance plans. Mr. Cozad also reported on a finalized agreement with Cemex to utilize their pits currently mined for storage. In conclusion, he urged the group to provide responses to requests for water level data needed to complete their District’s annual engineering investigation.

➤ **Basin Technical Advisory Committee** – Tom Crowley reported on the following BTAC items from the meeting:

- 2012 Regional Water Management Plan – The Engineering Subcommittee recommended that the artificial recharge target for the San Bernardino Basin Area be set at 80,000 acre feet, based on a model run scenario.
- Conjunctive Use Storage Rule – Draft revisions were distributed to the committee and comments will come back to the BTAC for recommendations.
- Mr. Tinchler reported that the Water Conservation Subcommittee discussed regional programs and benefits related to lower costs.
- H2O Solar Race – The committee met with participating schools at Yucaipa Valley Water District. Discussion included a proposed budget, wood donations being provided to the schools to build the boats, the location where the event will be held and SBVMWD’s donation of \$5,000.

➤ **Seven Oaks Dam Water Quality Committee** – This item was discussed earlier in the meeting. Mr. Cozad summarized a conference call with the USACE. Discussion included the water quality portion and the need to balance it with water conservation and releasing water from behind the dam quickly to insure less build up in the debris pool. Mr. Cozad also reported the group agreed to conduct executive level meetings on a monthly basis to continue discussions.

➤ **Santa Ana Sucker Task Force** – No report.

7. **Additional Items/Comments, Suggestions for Next Meeting** – George Aguilar reported on a presentation made at the ACWA conference titled, “Toilet to Tap.” Discussion included the public’s perception of drinking water from the sewer.

Mr. Cozad further reported his Board’s approval of an \$80,000 contract for cleaning and maintenance of the spreading ponds, and completion of the principals of the Collaborative Agreement between SBVWCD and SBVMWD. He also led a discussion on the topic of Congressman Lewis’ conceptual plan to utilize SBVWCD’s facilities for a treatment system, which will keep water local for recharge. The system would potentially be operated by East Valley Water District (EVWD).

➤ **Basin Technical Advisory Committee** – Matt Litchfield announced that the comments for the draft conjunctive use rules for the basin are due next week. Mr. Litchfield also reported on the revised annual management plan recharge allocations. Mr. Tincher expanded the report with regard to the SBVMWD’s approval of the storage of 30,000 acre feet of water under a cooperative agreement with Metropolitan Water District, which would potentially provide additional water in the valley during dry years.

➤ **Seven Oaks Dam Water Quality Committee** – Bob Tincher reported an eighteen month delay anticipated for the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) study. Mr. Tincher also reported on an interim water control program needed and that SBVMWD had shared a model on release rates with the USACE. Mr. Tincher anticipated a report being issued by the USACE regarding additional funds for project overruns.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M.

1. **Introductions were made.**
2. **Approvals of Minutes** –M/S/C (Aranda – Nelson) to approve Minutes from the July 14, 2011 meeting.
3. **Presentation** – Daniel Bruder of Niagara Conservation presented the Aquagy Program, including their cost effective all-in-one Stealth Toilet kits. Mr. Bruder said the high efficiency toilets used only 0.8 gallons of water per flush, cutting the current federal mandated flush rate in half. Mr. Bruder explained that Niagara Conservation's latest innovation in water conservation programs could save up to 40,000 gallons and 2590 kWh per year for local water agency customers, for a savings of up to \$500 to \$600 per year. Proposition 84 funding could potentially fund implementation of pilots for the conservation programs. Mr. Bruder announced he has been invited to make the presentation at the upcoming Basin Technical Advisory Committee Conservation sub-committee meeting.
4. Sam Fuller reported on the following SBVMWD activities:
 - Public hearing and adoption of Resolution No. 987 to Adopt the 2010 Regional Urban Water Management Plan (RUWMP) for the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District.
 - Authorization of Geophysical Surveys of the proposed expansion of the Santa Ana River Recharge Ponds.

- Authorization of a proposed new turnout from the SARC Pipeline to Recharge State Water Project water in the Santa Ana River and Additional Environmental Work for the Enhanced Recharge Project.
- Authorization of the Calendar Year 2011 Cooperative Recharge Program.
- Adoption of Resolution No. 990 Determining the Amount of Money Needed to Make Annual Payment for Indebtedness Approved by the Voters in which the property tax rate was set at \$0.165 per 100 dollars of assessed valuation.

5. Legislative Update- Manny Aranda reported on the current United States budget and credit rating. Mr. Aranda discussed the possible conflict in districts for Congressmen Joe Baca and Jerry Lewis, as well as contact with local legislators indicating their interest in water and attending future USAWRA meetings. Mr. Aranda also reported the San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District will have five divisions instead of seven, as Senate Bill 235 has become law.

6. Other – Sam Fuller reported that Gary Sturdivan, who has managed the ERNIE program, is set to retire from the East Valley Water District. Mr. Fuller reported that he is on the Steering Committee working to continue the ERNIE program and thanked East Valley Water District for their support. He encouraged members of the association to contact him if they had any questions.

7. Committee Reports & Schedules:

- **Recharge Committee** –Daniel Cozad summarized the San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District’s (SBVWCD) recharge report distributed to the group. Mr. Cozad stated the District’s basins have been cleaned up for delivery of State Water Project (SWP) water. Mr. Cozad also announced Arnold “Bud” Wright’s retirement celebration at the Cuttle Weir, coupled with the celebration of the million acre feet of water recharged.
- **Basin Technical Advisory Committee** – Tom Crowley reported the Basin Technical Advisory Committee Engineering Subcommittee and the IRWMP BTAC met on August 1st. Discussions included agency participation in the RUWMP, the EPA’s public health goal for Chromium-6 to 0.02 ppb., the State Department of Public Health’s (CDPH) maximum contaminant level (MCL) investigation phase for Chromium-6 and the impact to the local water agencies. Mr. Crowley also announced the inception of the BTAC Conservation Subcommittee, which will chair the annual Solar Cup as well as other conservation programs.
- **Seven Oaks Dam Water Quality Committee** – Ron Buchwald reported that the Seven Oaks Dam Water Quality Committee is experiencing difficulty in obtaining conclusions from the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Mr. Buchwald also stated that State of California Department of Water Resources (DWR) Division of Safety of Dams has raised a concern related to the Seven Oaks Dam.
- **Santa Ana Sucker Task Force** – Sam Fuller reported that the Santa Ana Sucker Task Force is considering litigation related to the December 2010 designation of

habitat by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). The Task Force agencies are individually considering their decision to participate in the litigation.
